Who can protect you if things do not go as planned. Clarify what they want versus what they can get. Create linkages to key stake holders.

## ROBUST DESIGN - SET NOMINALS WHERE INSENSITIVE

Continuing with the robust design series, this time we focus on setting nominal values. Because everything is sensitive, it is impossible to be totally insensitive. However, there are areas that behave better than others. This is the danger in using point solutions. With just a little change, do we fall off of a cliff?
